INT. HIGH SCHOOL HALL - DAY

The camera focuses in on THEODORE, an incoming senior this year. As he confidently walks through the hall with his rule-follower friend LIAM, they pause in front of the elevator. A sign on the elevator reads "MUST HAVE PERMISSION FOR ELEVATOR USE" in bold red letters.

THEODORE

Hey, Liam, we're big shot seniors now. Wanna ride the elevator to history class?

LIAM

Nah, I'm not trying to get in trouble on the first day.

Liam points to the sign on the elevator door.

LIAM

Read the sign. Your on your own for this one.

THEODORE

Don't be such a pussy cat. Come on, seniors never get in trouble.

LIAM

I don't know, Theo. Teachers have been extra strict this year. I'm just gonna go to class.

THEODORE

See ya, loser.

Theo hops in the elevator by himself as Liam heads over to the staircase. Theo presses the button, titled Floor 3. We see the elevator doors dramatically close behind Theo.

INT. ELEMENTARY SCHOOL HALL - DAY

Theo steps out of the elevator, looking around with a perplexed expression. The elevator doors close behind him.

THEODORE

(mutters to himself)

Wait a minute, this isn't the
history floor. Where the hell am
I?

Kindergarteners walk by in organized lines behind their
teachers.

One teacher, MS. GREEN, approaches Theo as her class follows
behind.

MS. GREEN

Oh honey, are you lost? I know
Kindergarten is brand new for
you, but you're supposed to stay
in line. Here, you can hold my
hand while we walk back to the
classroom. You can be our first
day line leader!

Theo looks up at Ms. Green with an expression of confusion.

THEODORE

Huh? Kindergarten?

MS. GREEN

Don't be scared, I know it's your
first day of big boy school.
We're all in this together! I'm
Ms. Green, what's your name?

THEODORE

Theo. You--you don't understand.
I'm not supposed to be here, I'm
a senior in high school!

MS. GREEN

(laughing
hysterically)

Hahaha! You're a funny little
guy! You still have 12 more years
to go!

Ms. Green leads her students back to class, dismissing Theo's
absurd comment. As Ms. Green drags Theo by the hand, a smile
creeps across Theo's face.

THEODORE

(nodding his head, to
himself)

Kindergarten...

INT. ELEMENTARY CLASSROOM - DAY

On his way into the classroom, Theo catches a glimpse of himself in a mirror titled "BE YOU" on the wall. Seeing the reflection of his younger kindergarten self, he gasps.

MS. GREEN

OK, class, circle up on the rug
criss-cross applesauce!

Ms. Green begins teaching a lesson on following the rules for her first day lecture. We see Theo encircled by tiny kindergarteners on the rug, some of whom are dazing off or picking their noses.

MS. GREEN (CONT'D)

Rules are here to follow and for
your safety. As a reward for
following the rules, I will hand
out star stickers when I see the
rules in use.

Ms. Green points to a list of rules written on the board and starts reading them intently.

MS. GREEN (CONT'D)

Rule number one: be polite.
Always say please and thank you.

THEODORE

(whispers to himself)
Forget about history class. I
forgot how easy kindergarten was.

MS. GREEN

Rule number two: keep your hands
and feet to yourself.

Theo reclines on the rug with his hands behind his head. In the process, he knocks a student over. This student seems unphased and continues to pick his nose.

THEODORE

(whispers to himself)

MS. GREEN

THEODORE

(sighing)

Yeah, yeah, my bad. Dude, that's nasty. PLEASE never do that again. Thank you.

MS. GREEN

(clapping)

Good progress, Theo! You earn a star sticker for that! Alright class, time to rotate stations!

Theo makes his way over to the foam block station.

THEODORE

Man, I love kindergarten! I don't know what was wrong with that elevator, but I hope I stay here forever!

MS. TOBEY

(sarcastic tone)

Did you learn your lesson at
Kindergarten?

THEODORE

Damn it!
